## Top Laurel swimmers smash meet records

West Laurel's Matt Stevens broke three meet records in the July 12 Laurel Invita-tion Swim Meet at Fairland Aquatic Center, a contest that had a total of nine meet records shattered.

The annual event has top swimmers from five Laurel teams (Montpelier, West Laurel, Laurel City, Russett and West Arundel) competing for city-wide brag-ging rights. All teams also compete in the Prince-Mont Swim League, but are split-up in different league divisions and rarely get a chance to compete.

Stevens broke the record in boys 15-18 100-meter freestyle at 54.78, 15-18 50-meter breaststroke at 32.75 and 100-meter

Russett swimmer Taylor Hicks broke two meet records: girls 13-14 50-meter butterfly at 31.18, and girls 13-14 breast-stroke at 38.31. She added a win in the 13-14 IM and was a triple winner.

meet record for boys 10-and-under 25meter butterfly with a time of 16.50, and
also won boys 9-10 50-meter freestyle and

Triple-winner Dylan Buehler, also from Montpelier, broke two meet records — boys 11-12 50-meter butterfly at 31.31, and 50-meter breaststroke at 38.43 — and topped it off with a win in the 12-andunder IM.

Other triple winners included Russett swimmers Allison Ritter, for 8-and-under 25-meter freestyle, breaststroke and backstroke, and 15-18 swimmer Michaela Guild, who won 100-meter freestyle, 50meter breaststroke and 100-meter IM

Three West Arundel swimmers were double winners at the Invitational: Hunter Tessier, in boys 13-14 butterfly and backstroke, Kellianne Venit, for girls 13-14 50-meter free and back, and Micah Norsworthy, for boys 8-and-under 25-meter freestyle and backstroke. Other double winners were Nick Mills, of Montpelier, who won in boys 13-14 freestyle and 50-meter breaststroke, and Erin Kane, of West Laurel, who won for girls 11-12 50-meter butterfly and 12-and-under 100 IM.

Guild was seeded fourth in the 100 free but dropped four seconds from her seed time and edged top-seeded jes-sica Sweitzer (West Laurel) by four-tenths of a second. The 50 breast came down to the wall as Guild out-touched defending champion Stephanie Blau (Montpelier) by six one-hundredths of a second. Seeded fourth in the 100 IM, Guild dropped four seconds and defeated Sweitzer and Blau by nearly a second to complete the day's most unexpected triple.

Montpelier settled for fourth in the team standings, but two of its younger swimmers served notice that they will be a force for at least the next six summers. Dylan Buehler won to the lift at least six summers. Dylan Buenter won the 11-12 boys 50 butterft? (31.31), 50 breast (38.43) and 100 IM (1:15.96) by a combined margin of nearly 34 seconds. He established new meet records in the fly and breast.
